Hey guys, hope you all are continuing to be healthy and hopeful still!

Thank you all for the continual prayers and love for so many here!!

Summer has been so encouraging and such a beautiful reminder of how much God is moving, and we just want to be faithful with what HE continues to give!

It has been huge!! Because, we saw a girl who is friends with our guy who just gave his life to Jesus on spring break and was agnostic; we got to see her come to the end of her journey of being atheist for 10 years!! Yes, she gave her life to Jesus at the beginning of summer before we were really getting to be in her life. And we just so thank God for how he just never gives up. And because of their friend connection, she is now coming and involved with our students and groups here and sharing her testimony online, and helping other believers see how good God is. So, we are just loving the opportunity to be faithful with what God has given us: a grad student now alive in Jesus. Now we get to disciple with her and watch her continue to be a part of HIS mission.

We have been meeting weekly by facilitating a guys group, and also a worship night that really is just a small group right now. These have been on average about 2 hours long or more each time; and one of our Buddhist friends keeps coming and coming and then hangs out with them after and during the week. We are praying for him and keep trying to love and serve him. And then we have been meeting through summer consistently with the cheerleader coach and her husband. These times

together with my wife and I last about 2 1/2 hours, each time with sharing of their past, struggles, and lots of questions about God and why things happen, etc. Sometimes I think we feel like a bad boxer in just so many real and honest questions that come everywhere and we may not have all the answers that fit neatly in the time we have, but we so know HE does. And what we love is they are now reading the Bible on their own with the Bible app and an old school physical bible, ha. It has been just so amazing to think a year ago we were just trying to love "their cheer kids" by bringing blueberries and Gatorade; and now we are getting to bring so much more than food for the tummy...but now they are connecting more and more to God, the REAL FOOD.

Truman is planning to be open, and we just got addresses of incoming freshmen who marked Baptist preference on their entrance forms; so, our students are having fun handwriting them (yes, old school for sure) a small letter to welcome them. We are actually excited, because even though we will ask everyone to wear masks when are together, and do more cleaning, etc., I think the conversations we have been having all summer that have been lasting over 2 hours with every group about real issues like racism, and sex, being ambitious in life, and genderbias in our world and our churches, and why Jesus says he is the only way, to just name a few...We are going to get the chance to continue more conversations like these with them but also with new students we hope. There has been a lot of positive feedback around how much they are liking how we as a group are talking about things they don't get to ask or talk about much with other believers, and how we are connecting the Scriptures and God's heart to why God says and does what he does around these things.

It maybe summer, and a virus, and seems like a time to maybe just slow down; but I love that we get to continue to be a part of HIS mission actively and with intention, and that we may have to keep changing how we do things (wear masks, etc.) But, just like when you are in a restaurant and everyone else is done but your still eating and talking, and the server comes to take your plate—we are going: "ugnh-uhh, we're not finished yet".

We're not finished yet.

Because we know HE is not finished yet....not wanting anyone to perish.



August Birthdays



Most times when a hymn is written its subject is some idea that the author or composer wants to emphasize in song. But sometimes a hymn will sum up its author or composer's ministry. That is the case in this hymn, "Rescue the Perishing", by Fanny Crosby.

According to the book, "Then Sings My Soul", the origins of this hymn began one night in Cincinnati when Ms. Crosby was addressing a group of blue-collar workers. As she approached the end of the speech, she had an overwhelming sense that "some mother's boy" in the audience "must be rescued that night". She ended her talk sharing this feeling with the audience and asking that if there was someone that fit that description to see her afterwards.

After the service there was a young man who indeed met her and told her that he had told his mother he would meet her in heaven, but with his current circumstances he thought that it would not be possible. Fanny led him to Christ – "Rescuing the Perishing." Returning to her room that night, all she could think about was rescuing the perishing. She wrote the complete hymn that night.

The story of that young man does not end there. Thirty-five years later Fanny was recounting that story in Massachusetts and someone came forward. He was the young man in her account, and ever since the night he first met her he tried to always lead a consistent Christian life. She later described it as one of the most gratifying experiences of her life.

At age sixty, she began working in a rescue mission in lower Manhattan, witnessing to the lost--again, rescuing the perishing.
