



Recently, several of my newsletter articles have focused on some of the Psalms and their praise of God in worship. During this time of uncertainty as we approach the holiday season of Thanksgiving, I wish to focus on one particular psalm - #105.

From the text you can read that this psalm was written after the Exodus. The psalmist begins by saying, "Give thanks to the Lord, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done." Then the psalmist begins to list events and people that God used to fulfill the covenant He made with Abraham — the giving of Canaan to the Israelites as their own land.

As you read the text, you can imagine the upheaval and struggle that was occurring to God's people in those days and the feelings of uncertainty that they must have felt then. But, more importantly, you can read of the signs and wonders that God performed to bring about the fulfillment of His promise.

The last few verses of the psalm restate the fulfillment of God's covenant and the reason for it – "that they might keep his precepts and observe his laws."

So, even in our time of uncertainty, remember the trials God's people have faced over time and how obeying Him brought them through it.
