



We will continue to explore the role of a Church Member in the newsletter for the next few months.



A Note from the Minister of Music



Every so often I share with you the origin of one of the hymns we sing in worship. These days many of our more contemporary songs are written by professional Christian songwriters and performers. But it was not always so in earlier times.

The author of "The Solid Rock", Edward More was a cabinet maker by trade when he wrote the words to the hymn. As he tells of his experience in the book "Then Sings My Soul" one morning on the way to work, he decided to write a hymn on the "Gracious Experience of a Christian." By the time he reached his shop he already had the chorus written. By day's end the entire hymn had been composed.

On the following Sunday he was asked by a fellow church member to visit that member's wife who was very ill. The member told More that his routine was to sing a hymn, read some Scripture and pray before he went to Sunday evening service, but that day was unable to do so because he had misplaced his hymnbook. More told the man that he (More) had some verses in his pocket and they could sing that instead. They did, and after service that night his friend said that his wife enjoyed them very much and could she have a copy.

More composed two more verses that night and took them over to the woman. He was so pleased with her reaction to the hymn that he had a thousand copies printed for distribution.

At age 55, More entered the ministry and gave up his carpentry to pastor the Horsham, Sussex Baptist Church where he retired after leading them for 21 years.

I urge you to consider the "Solid Rock" of Christ in your life and always rely on His strength.
