We/You are not perfect!

Many Christians struggle with the acceptance of their own imperfection. The statement above "We/You are not perfect!" is meant to challenge our complacency in who we think we are. Paul in his letter to the Romans challenges the identity complacency of the Jewish Christians in Rome. In the first few chapters of Romans Paul makes it clear that "there is no distinction" (3:22) between Jews and Gentiles when it comes to righteousness we find in Christ Jesus. "We are all sinners and fall short of the glory of God." (3:23) Accepting this realization does not denote an approval of our sins. It proclaims to others and ourselves we realize our imperfection and our need for the saving grace of Christ Jesus.

When it comes to the church as a whole we cannot ignore or dismiss our imperfections. We are no different than the early churches found in the NT. The early churches struggled with disunity, lack of commitment, idolatry, and an abandonment of sound doctrine. The church today has many of the same struggles and there needs to be an acceptance of our falling short of His glory. Again this does not mean we will approve of our imperfections but realize them and seek to correct our course. If we unite together for the sake of the Gospel, we will see his Kingdom grow.

but just in wanting to try to reconnect with his faith from growing up in a Christian home. So, this past month, he reached out to ask if we could start meeting to talk about faith and being involved with church again. He is still choosing to live a gay lifestyle, and in our first conversation we got to share again about who God is and how there is a right way and a way that leads to death and not life in Him. And we would think from over a year ago sharing this and still now that he would not want to keep wanting to talk, but he is. So we know God is doing so much more than we even realize and your prayers and support are being used by Him. We keep hoping as we count the conversations that he would give Jesus the keys to his heart and have a life changing encounter with God and begin following Him as Lord of all of his life....and be - All in. So your prayers, please keep them coming!

PS We have had several in our community struggle with emotional unhealth, which then leads to spiritual unhealth, from seeing us being at the ER at the hospital, to connecting

them to counseling services, to helping others connect to others in the community and in serving. They are trying to fight for peace in HIM, and we are so glad we get to walk with them and help them know they can be struggling with anxiety or depression or fear, and it doesn't mean they don't have a deep relationship with God; it just means they are human. We have seen progress in the healing through Him and the ownership they are taking and help they are allowing others to give. Please be praying for them, and our community to help them know Jesus and healing and hope in HIM and that they, like us all, have to fight for peace every day of our lives because faith in God is not a one time thing, and being faithful and having peace, love, and hope does not come by accident or by apathy...but comes with intention.

Go beyond obligation....live a life of intention for HIM.

Easter! One of the two most important days that all believers celebrate. It is a day that we celebrate not with decorations but in word and in music.

One of our more well-known Easter hymns is "Crown Him With Many Crowns." A glorious hymn that describes Jesus after His Resurrection and in His place in heaven is rich in its word depiction of the Risen Savior. The authorship lists two names for the words of this hymn. It was not because this hymn was composed as a collaboration, but for another reason entirely.

According to the book "Then Sings My Soul" the hymn was originally written as six eight-line stanzas by Matthew Bridges based on Revelation 19:12. Bridges called this hymn, "The Song of The Seraphs." A staunch anti-Catholic when this hymn was written, he later converted to Catholicism in 1848.

In 1874, Godfrey Thring, a staunch Anglican clergyman thought that some of verses were too Catholic, so he wrote six new verses for the same song.

As the years went by, the verses have become intermingled by subsequent editors who mixed the verses at their whim.

In our hymnal verses one, three and four are from Bridges' version while verse two is from Thring's version. Also, Bridges' verses are not in the order that he wrote them.

As you celebrate this Easter, I ask you to try to picture that morning and the joy those first witnesses experienced when they realized what had happened and what that meant for them.
