### **Resound Report**

The Resound Network collaboration is moving forward! We have already completed phase one of the six phase process which was to **Explore** the possibilities. We are currently in the **Discover** phase which will include surveys of our attenders and people in the community. To get the clearest picture of our church, all attenders need to complete the survey. Please plan to participate and share your views! This will help us to discover why we are here, where we are now, and what we need to do to fulfill our purpose. Additional components of the Discover phase include surveys of ministry leaders, and reviews of trends in finances, our constitution, and our bylaws.

The remaining phases will be:

**Present**-share the information from the Discover phase;

**Recommend**-the Resound Network develops recommendations;

Affirm-recommendations shared with church;

Church Decision-discuss and determine whether the recommended plan be adopted or not and;

**Implement**-if the church commits to it, the plan is followed.

The Resound Team includes Deacons, Personnel Committee, and Church Council. You may contact anyone on the team if you have questions or input. There are copies of the Resound Network Process in the foyer if you care to look it over.

#### BSU Update ALL IN

The year has been such a good, miraculous year as the community came out of a pandemic with only a handful of students and

a leadership team that went from 8 to 1 person. Now it has become a community full of life, serving and intentionally trying to create moments to share the message of Jesus. We now have over 30 involved weekly in dynamic ways. It has been miraculous in seeing others connect to God, renewing or rediscovering their faith, and just seeing these "kids" serving so many! We are so thankful for how God has blessed us with so many who support this community of missionaries at Truman! Our students have sacrificed and given so much to serve and share when it was challenging to have the conversations and inconvenient to keep showing up to try and be a voice of hope! We are so proud of them! And so so grateful for what God is doing through so many loving us from all around the planet.

Four of our students defined their faith as their own and were baptized here. Our local churches are so intentional in helping us keep making disciples, helping students re-discover their faith, or consider a relationship with Jesus for the first time! They are an active part of His mission, saving the world through Jesus. They are "ALL IN"!

We were invited to be a part of a large event to help bring healing and hope as they remembered two who had committed suicide. The event tried to help others struggling with mental health. The organizer shared later how our words of encouragement and hope moved her to tears. She later left us a card sharing how grateful she was to be reminded of the Christian love that she has seen before. We keep trying to be a voice of hope among a culture that has a lot of darkness.

Because of so much support and sacrifice from others, we were able to host two days of free food for students during finals week. We connected to so many we have not really connected with before. Several shared they wish they knew about the BSU earlier. I am so grateful that God is doing more than we could ever do ourselves and experiencing more than they expected. God is so good! ...so that no one is left behind but can have a life-changing relationship with Jesus!
