Benevolent Committee Spotlight. As a committee outreach, the Benevolent Ccommittee tries to help folks who call the church asking for assistance. So far this year we have received 42 requests for temporary lodging, 41 for help with utility bills, 10 for food, 7 for gas, 6 for rent, and 9 for miscellaneous needs. Not all requests can be approved; we have a limited budget and follow some general guidelines. Requests are confidential. Callers may be advised of other community resources and invited to attend services at HSBC. Our community does have its homeless and those who struggle to meet their daily needs; we are blessed to be able to offer a hand and a prayer.

Thank you so so much for all the prayers, support, love, and giving - there is so much we are grateful for!! Summer has been really good and God has been kind to us. We have a remnant of students here and we see them connecting with the less frantic schedule of summer. We asked them what they want to do for summer. They wanted to keep having a small group to talk about the scriptures and worship together.

We are now meeting weekly at our house in our living room. Discussions and questions about faith and the scriptures are beginning. We are seeing students that we have been getting to invest in this past semester now coming to the small group. Something really exciting is that not all who are coming are believers. It is challenging as we keep trying to invite and make a place for others to come even if they do not believe yet.

On our first night we asked them what topics or scriptures they would like to cover. We got several ideas. Then the guy who grew up around church, but is still trying to decide if Jesus is who he wants to give his life to, asked if we could cover the topic of - Who is Jesus and why is he worth following? This guy is asking real questions. I love that he feels safe to come while he is on a real journey trying to figure out who God is to him and what faith means.

We are trying to hear the mission Jesus is on and that we are part of. We have seen our students grow and be intentional in creating moments to be known by love and to be a voice of hope to others. So far we have 3 guys who are going on campus with us during the summer. Historically, we have not seen our guys connect to the community. I love the intentional work that they are taking on. To end let me take you back to the dead of winter. One of our students from Vietnam who was a believer when she came, was able to connect to the community here through such a loving host family at Hamilton Street Baptist Church. We loved watching her connect to church here in town, to find community among others her age and to see her sharing about Jesus with others in the BSU. It was so exciting to celebrate with her as she was baptized and is "all in" for Jesus! PS - here are a couple videos from some of our students sharing about Jesus. 
