If you haven't already heard, a new adult small group started October 2. The co-ed class will be studying the book of James and Dan Willis will lead. If you're interested, we can get you connected!

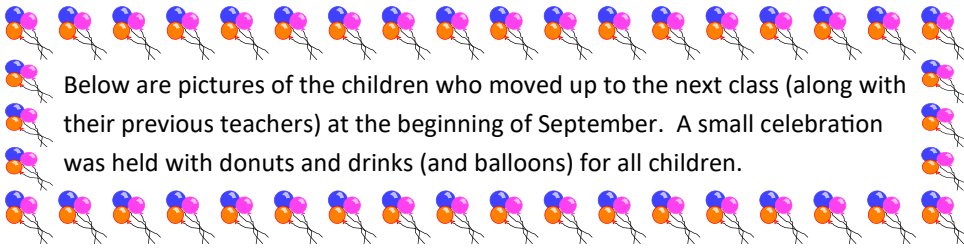

BSU Update...will not give them up!! Thank you all so much for all the love, prayers, and support you give to the BSU as missionaries to a campus we love. We have had some wonderful opportunities to be serving and engaging with students in groups and one on one. We have handed out over 1,500 flowers as a way to connect and engage with students as we try to plant seeds in people's minds and hearts. It has been so exciting to see students going out on campus to engage with students through surveys we do. This has allowed us to engage with students who are Christians, or share an interest in hope, but a hope devoid of the love of God. I am so excited to see our community going from being known for handing out flowers, to being known for "the guys that ask questions and have conversations on campus?" We try to keep creating moments for others to hear how God has changed our lives. We have seen our students having success through Sunday meals they prepare for other BSU students, but also many who are not coming to worship or are engaging in anything structured - not yet... It has been hard to see so many that are lost and just living what they think is life - but is just existing and not being alive in His love and forgiveness. We have gotten to see our students engaging with: Christians who are not engaged in His community - the Church, Hindi who believe cows are gods along with other gods they have, Muslims, Japanese who go to Shinto temple, bisexuals, homosexuals, and those who have no religion. There are those that we don't even know what they believe - and probably don't even know themselves. So we keep praying and keep trying to go in HIM. We are so encouraged by all of you who are praying, loving through messages, and sacrificially giving of your money and time to help us reach more in Jesus. We try to keep in contact with as many as we can after they graduate. One Hindi girl shared about her grandma passing away. It was so hard to know she and her family's hopes to see her again are misled by what they have been exposed to at home. We traveled to a wedding reception of a girl who was the vice president of the atheist club as a student. We have kept in contact with her and she expressed interest in going to church by the end of her school time here. We are still hoping she and her husband will have a life changing relationship with Jesus. It moves us and reminds us - that darkness will NOT give them up willingly! MISSOURI MISSIONS OFFERING

Our church goal for MMO was \$1,200. As of September 27 we had given \$2,390. Praise the Lord! If you have not given yet and still wish to do so, there are envelopes in the pews for this purpose. Here is some information about what this offering supports.

The Rheubin L. South Missouri Missions Offering (MMO) is our state's annual missions offering that supports projects in four areas of ministry:

Making disciples – sports evangelism; a prison extension campus of Hannibal-LaGrange University; Vacation Bible School training and resource development; youth evangelism and missions; and the state fair ministry of the Missouri DOM Fellowship.

Collegiate ministries – collegiate summer missions mentoring initiative; international student ministry missions conference and regional gatherings; and a new technical school initiative.

Multiplying churches – next-step requests for church multipliers; partnership missions in Mexico, Italy, and Minnesota/Wisconsin; and strategic missionary development.

Developing leaders – disaster relief equipment and volunteer readiness; Missouri WMU; church leader development; new pastors' conference/revitalization pastors' conference; Missouri Baptist Resound Network; Baptist Builders and volunteer mobilization; and hunger relief.

In addition, 17 percent of MMO receipts go to the Missouri Baptist Children's Home, which provides spiritual guidance, counseling, and a safe haven from abuse and neglect at five state campuses. And 10 percent of MMO gifts go back to the associations of the giving churches, where the funds support regional mission projects.

spaghetti, garlic bread, and salad

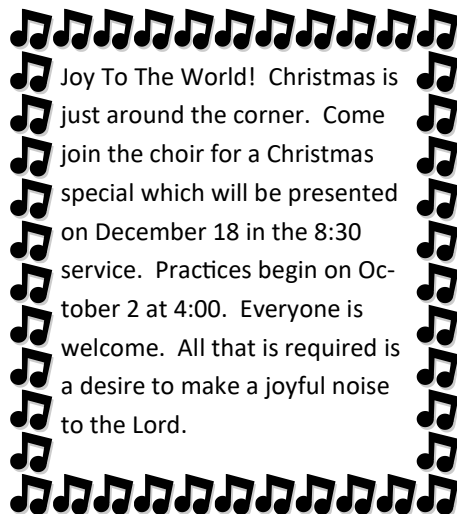

The women are also organizing a craft and card ministry. Contact Karen

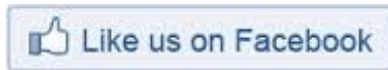


