Dr. Jonathan Hayashi

I am personally excited to jump into a new sermon series titled, "Broken Christians" from 1 Corinthians. I'm excited to preach expositionally for the next several months!

We are broken people aren't we? Broken people together? That's the church! Just so you know, if you are seeking a perfect church, you won't find it here. The church is in great need of awakening and renewal.

Maybe that is a huge "shocker" for some people in the room, but don't be surprised that when people become Christians they do not instantly become angelic hosts. Yes, we are positionally justified in Christ and declared "holy" but we must continue to learn to grow as broken sinners who are saved by Jesus.

At the same time though, we have to stop excusing ourselves by saying, "Well, I am just a work in progress" and continue living in sin, which is a blatant disobedience before God and licensure for foolish living. That is just a jerk move and brings dishonor to the name of Christ.

Paul wrote this letter to correct problems that he "heard" reported to him by the people from Chloe's household which says, "For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brothers." (1 Corinthians 1:11).

If Paul was alive today, I can guarantee you, churches in America would be getting a letter and it wouldn't be pretty!

Paul also gives answers to Christians who are asking some daunting questions. What were some of those questions? I'm so glad you asked. Here are a few topics:

- Factions,
- Lawsuits,
- Immorality,
- Abuse of the Lord's Supper,
- Spiritual gifts.
- Doubts about the resurrection.

Even the name Corinth was so corrupt the verb korinthiazomai meant to "act immorally". These were unruly, hard-drinking, and sexually promiscuous people. I wouldn't want to be from that part of town!

Well, with all seriousness, yes, it was not a perhaps "ideal" or a place of ministry that is done, but there were believers there and there was a church. God loves that church, even though they are a little "immature" they are not immune to the gospel.

Let's face it, friends. Today the church has many problems. Some of them are small, but some of them are "big problems". Some of them are disagreement over music choices, disagreement over building projects, disagreement over mission programs, disagreement over minor theology, or even disagreement on the color of the carpet! Brothers and sisters in Christ, we need to figure out how to get out of the mess sometimes we put ourselves into.

The good news is, those are exactly the issues Paul dives into in the book of 1 Corinthians. Here, Paul is about to spank the saints for their wrongdoing. Paul gives thern corrections for their bad behavior and answers questions that they are facing. This sermon series is going to help us move forward together as broken Christians.

Make sure to bring your Bible, notebook and pen as we dig deep from God's rich Word.

Resound Report

The Resound Team met with Pastor Jonathan on July 16. The session began with creating a timeline of good and painful memories about events, people, or ministries at HSBC since its beginning. Blue stickers indicated good memories and yellow stickers denoted painful memories. Pastor Jonathan pointed out that a lot of things that happen in a church's history are actually a reaction to something that occurred. These things are all important to the spiritual dynamic of the church. We broke these events down into decades and talked about them. Pastor Jonathan said it is good to know your past. But when thinking of a car you see things through the rearview window but your front windshield is a much bigger picture. God is not done with HSBC. The group looked at the seven churches in Revelation and what was said about them. Then they considered what God would say about HSBC when he looks at it. He might compliment us that we are Christ centered, supportive, hard-working, faithful, friendly, benevolent, and Biblically based. Concerns might include division (slander), pride, financial stewardship, discouraged and tired, lost our first love, distracted, lack of intentional mission, and need more representation from multiple generations. Our corrections might be to hold fast to God, we might be pruned, we might need to repent of sin, humble ourselves, and ask for forgiveness.

Pastor Jonathan's goal is to clarify our mission, values, strategy, and vision. Our mission is our purpose and **what** we do. Our values are our priorities and **why** we do what we do. Our strategy is the process of **how** to achieve our ongoing goal. Our vision is **where we are going** and what we want our future to look like. We need to re-dream without being nostalgic, questioning, or blaming others.

It's been a really encouraging summer seeing how the gospel travels through human relationships. One of our girls who is here working on campus, has been getting to know one of her coworkers, also a Truman student. On Saturday she



invited her over for some hot tea and just getting together. Even though they've had real conversations where they differ on opinions or ideas, it's been really exciting to see the conversations still happening and our student seeing her coworker as someone she cares about. And maybe causing her friend to rethink what she considered Christianity to be.

She had her coworker over and was just planning to be the two of them but then her roommate came by with her boyfriend. Then 2 students from the BSU stopped by to say hi. So, it ended up being a morning of tea with a small community of our BSU students and this girl. What was really cool was that later the girl shared with our student just how welcoming the whole group was. And just how different it was to be there among a group of friends that were so kind, and just "different". God is so good because it wasn't even the plan for our student to have so many others join in, but it was just yet again so encouraging to see how God just shows up and does things just because our student was willing...willing to try and get to know this girl, and to share her life with her and share tea with her, and just try to invite her into her home. It was such a beautiful reminder that one person following Jesus, and being willing to go, to try, can almost be overlooked because you could write it off as a they're just nice and kind and that's who they are and could dismiss that Jesus was the reason. But then, when you get three or four or five in this case, that it becomes so hard for somebody to dismiss or overlook that maybe there's more to Jesus than they thought. It is so exciting how the prayers for the students who are here at the BSU just trying to be a witness and trying to be a light, just how much your prayers are being heard and used to help them have such a desire for Jesus and a love to try and help people know Him. There are other things happening because of a spring break trip and how much our students were so kind and loving on the trip that it's connected several international students with us. They've continued to stay around, even though they do not believe the same thing at all. But they're in here and they're being loved by our students and they're being served with driving lessons and food and are sharing views. This past week one of them reached out and asked for a Bible so he could read on his own. He is having conversations with others, but now is wanting to read more. So that's incredible to think that for 18 years of his entire life, he's never had a Bible or a desire to want to read it. Now after a few short months, he's open and interested and actually wanting to read on his own, and is wanting to talk about what he is reading.


