#### Dr. Jonathan Hayashi - The Miracle of the Manger

**Tis the Season to be Jolly!** It's Christmas! This is a significant and a strategic moment in time. We all probably already know, but maybe some of you don't like the idea of Christmas. You feel like Christmas has become more a marketing, materialism, and minimizing the marginalized. But I want us to stop for a moment and think on, ponder upon, and meditate based on this glorious topic this season. C.S. Lewis in his book said it this way, "The central miracle asserted by Christians is the Incarnation. They say that God

became Man. Every other miracle prepares for this, or exhibits this, or results from this...." In the business of life, the busy streets of Bethlehem, in the business of routines of last-minute things, let us learn to pause, rest, be still and know that God is good because of the miracle street in Bethlehem. "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons." (Galatians 4:4-5).

#### Jesus Came in the Manger

"When the fullness of time was come" (v. 4). That really means right time, right moment he's right on time! Yes, most people did not recognize the significance of this, but in God's sovereign will and providential care, that was indeed the right moment. Jesus coming was God's divine plan from the very beginning of time. Here are several key Old Testament passages of Scripture where God made the promise of Christ coming on

Here are several key Old Testament passages of Scripture where God made the promise of Christ coming on many occasions.

- "Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:14).
- "O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days." (Micah 5:2).
- "When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son." (Hosea 11:1).

"The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14). Author John was pointing to Jesus! This was God himself, not God created Jesus. God always existed and there was never a time where God wasn't in existence.

"God sent forth his Son, born of woman" (v. 4). Who is this person that is God's Son? JESUS!

These are two significant truths we see here.

(1) Sent forth his Son = Son of God

(2) Born of woman = Son of man

What does that mean? Jesus was fully God and fully man at the very same time, which is called the "hypostatic union" This was not like one of those heretical teachings in the past called Arianism, where Jesus was not really God but more like a superman with a beginning. Jesus wasn't just a "superman", but Jesus was the God man! That is the very reason we can have, "Hope" in this CHRISTmas. That is the reason Christians can find radical and real purpose in this very moment because of joy in Jesus.

#### Jesus Came as the Ultimate Free Gift from God

Christmas is indeed a time of great celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ the Son of God. Not about the gifts, not about the wrapping, not about the nice meal we have around the dinner table. So, Christmas is not about the gift that is under the tree but the gift that was hung on the tree. That is what Christmas is all about. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16).

He came at the right time, at the right schedule at the right moment on earth. "My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies and from my persecutors!" (Psalm 31:15).

Maybe this is the message at this very moment you or your friend needed. A reminder of real "hope" and real "joy" this holiday season. "But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God," (John 1:12).

The Son of God became man so that man may become sons of God!

The ultimate gift you can have today is the gift miraculously sent, his Son at this moment, so that you and I may be redeemed by the blood of the Lamb. Christ has purchased us with the price of his own death to cleanse us from all unrighteousness and adopt us as children of God!

Merry Christmas everyone!! What a month November has been!! We saw students connecting with students and more students attending! Our students are



engaging with students on campus through clip-boarding, tabling, friendships, and just inviting people to things. We had a lot of activity on campus and planning events. It's been really encouraging seeing God work. We had one student really struggling with mental health. It caused some real concern and action that we had to take to connect them to the police and to good services. It's been encouraging to see how this community has helped our student so much. We get to keep helping them connect to people who help them on a road to getting healthier spiritually, mentally and in every way. It was encouraging to see how the relationships this community built with each other ended up being such a big reason for why this student was able to begin sharing. This led to knowing more and helping them connect to other professionals. I love that we all got to experience the reality that where Jesus is - healing is, in every way as we live lives of faith and take self-mastery of our lives as we all try to follow Jesus. Something else that reminded us that there really is a battle of light and darkness, of hope and despair, is getting to help another student as he is going through some challenges. We are watching him coming to more things and actually coming to church consistently for the first time in a very long time. It has been so uplifting to see how God is speaking and moving and using this community in spite of the mess we are, to keep trying to help others have a relationship with Jesus that changes everything. Because where Jesus is healing is. It's been so exciting to see this community realize that we can do both healing and Lordship at the same time. It's about care and calling together. It's exciting to see our students experiencing healing in their lives, reaching out to others, growing in their identity, and growing roots. They are striving to follow His word and be faithful. At the same time they are going out and sharing with others, having real conversations, taking real opportunities to help and serve others, and help them consider who Jesus is. I can't say enough about how proud I am of this group and how they serve and share about God and find healing at the same time. I just love how it can be both - healing AND Lordship. There's so much more like getting ready to decorate the BSU for Christmas and having one of our students from India text us asking about a Bible verse he would love to know more about. The BSU is becoming more and more a place people come to rather than running from or walking far around and away from. We just keep trying to help others become more open to faith. This community is trying to move with truth, and love together at the same time. Something exciting to end with is hearing our students sharing how there is such a proactive interest in the BSU among their friends and their peers and people they don't even know on campus. The BSU is being represented in such a way that it's causing curiosity and actually becoming the reverse of clip boarding. Instead of us going out and asking people questions, people are coming up to our students and asking them questions and being curious and wanting to know more. It is so amazing what God is doing. It is so encouraging because he is hearing your prayers and using your support. They are making an impact in the lives of our students and of the campus that we love and are trying to reach, from our president all the way down to a freshman. 
