BSU Update...It just gets better!!

Oh my goodness there's so much good God is doing and letting us get to be a part of in spite of the mess we are! He is so good and so kind!!Thank you all for all the loving support and prayers.... your prayers are definitely being heard!!



We've been back for just about a week and it's been so exciting. We were able to host a new meal for all the new international students and got to meet and interact with all of them and begin some new friendships. Before this event we started to have some really wonderful spiritual conversations with one of the students who went with us on our Spring Break mission trip from Uzbekistan! It's crazy. He came with us out of the blue on our Spring Break trip last year and then we were able to stay connected and helped him move to his new apartment. There really was no interest from him in anything remotely spiritual; he was kind but he didn't want to talk about faith at all for almost a year. Then last week as we were letting the International Student Office use our building for their 2 day orientation, our Uzbekistan friend walked in. He was part of their student staff for orientation. In front of all the other students he started talking and was sharing that he's been really been thinking about God the last three months. He started asking his friends questions and wanted to ask us and talk because he had so many questions. For a while before the orientation started, he just started asking and listening. Then he wanted to talk more later after the meal. That evening, we talked more as he asked lots of questions and just shared and listened. I just love how this community of students has continued to serve him and stay in touch with him. Now we are watching as he is asking and wanting to talk and we are getting to be a voice of hope as he has real questions about Jesus and about God, especially as he comes from a Muslim background.

On the second day of class we were able to host a free book and Bible table and had the most meaningful interactions I think we've ever had at our table. People asked questions, were curious and interested, or needed a Bible because they left theirs at home. Our students have been so amazing in how warm and welcoming they are.

And our students have been having spiritual conversations all over the place. One of our girls ended up in a 10 minute conversation at the campus bookstore with a girl who comes from a faith background, but hasn't really found a community here yet. The day after our first worship night we had a fifth year senior and a graduate student share how they had never experienced a Christian campus ministry like they did at our worship night. One of our girls has been having a lot of spiritual conversations with another international student who had also gone on our spring break trip last year. He has been reaching out to several people in our community as he continues to want to understand and know more about God and the Bible. He messaged me over Christmas break, asking about how he could listen to the Bible with an audio app. He's reading Genesis right now and the names are confusing, and he's back home in India, and is wanting to learn more about Christianity. A Vietnamese student who is an alumni now, is asking more questions and he is understanding more about who Jesus is and what the differences are between Him and other religions.

We try to share that we should always work from his love not for it and to count not just the conversions but also the conversations. So it's been exciting to see them having more and more conversations about Jesus. We watch our students serving others by taking them to the store, picking them up from the airport, teaching them how to drive, and giving them rides.

The last thing to share for now; one of the girls who came to our weekly worship night is a friend of one of our students, and has been having conversations with her. So it was encouraging to see her come with our student to worship. As our night was ending, our students organized to have a time for everyone to pair up and pray together. Our student and her friend paired up and as that time came to an end we could see our student jumping up and down. That's right, her friend that night gave Jesus her life. Wow God!! It just gets better!! I think that would be our thought as this community of students trying to follow Him and bring Jesus to others. It only just gets better - stay the course - genuinely trust God...it only gets better!!

Welcome Pastor Tim Ingle and family



appreciate him being here the last several months to help us transition to the next chapter for HSBC.




NOMINATING COMMITTEE


