#### Investing it well - Pastor Tim Ingle

Imagine this scenario: Today, you find an envelope on your kitchen table containing \$1,440 to spend. The caveat? It has to be spent today. Once the day's done, \$1,440 vanishes. Every day, you have a gift even more precious - 1,440 minutes. You spent that amount of time yesterday, and if you survive today, you'll expend the same. And the day after? You guessed it, another 1,440 minutes. What will you do with this invaluable gift?

Moses, who was assigned the duty of guiding God's people from Egypt to the Promised Land, comprehended the worth of time. He documents it in Psalm 90, likely written around the time of Numbers 13 and 14 when the people defied God. In this Psalm, Moses instructs us that our days are numbered and then guides us on how to invest the time that God bestows upon each of us.

**First, count your days**. Moses grasped the importance of time and sought God's help with it. Have you done the same? We read in <u>Psalm 90:12</u>, "So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." Whether God grants you 50 more minutes or 50 more years, time whizzes by, and then we depart. Reflect on your days and utilize them effectively.

**Secondly, get God's help**. Moses writes in <u>Psalm 90:14</u>, "Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days." God possesses all wisdom and resources that you require. He loves you with His perfect love. What do you have to lose by pursuing Him, connecting to His people, and finding contentment from Him? When you seek His help, God will provide it.

Lastly, act on the insight that God gives. Moses shares in Psalm 90:17, "Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands upon us; yes, establish the work of our hands!" Moses led effectively because he both heard and applied God's commands. How can you live for God today and invest what He's given you for His kingdom? Like Moses, you will have your share of setbacks and disappointments. And like Moses, when you're faithful with your days, God will help you make your days count.



Thank you all so much for all the love and support and prayers. We're so grateful!! God has been so kind this past month in hearing the conversations and interaction students are having with their friends and with others. We're hearing of friends who are starting to go to church and who are wanting to ask about faith and how students are on leadership at the BSU or what motivates them. It's been so exciting how our students have been trying to love Jesus and people and how their friends are hearing God's voice drawing them in so many ways. From a guy who messages our students over Spring Break asking if he can come with them to church back home, to a girl sharing that she just wants to read the Bible more and loves it and she doesn't know what's going on inside her in such a beautiful way.

A highlight of our past month was our weeklong spring break trip that we took to Minneapolis to serve with different agencies there and help people in need. A huge part of our trip every year is in the students we get to bring with us who have no Jesus. We ask our churches and alumni and friends to help scholarship and pay for their way, so that then we get the opportunity for an entire week to just influence their life, and influence their life for HIM because of all the time we are spending together and the worship and devotions we do every evening. And it was wonderful helping feed so many people locally across the ocean through meals that we packed and medical supplies but it was also an incredible week because we probably had the most spiritual conversations we've ever had on a mission trip that were one on one and one on five and one on three. It was humbling that when those conversations were ending at different times during the evening throughout the week and then as the week went on, to hear how students who didn't trust Jesus were being so moved. These moments were adding up to where students were sharing openly that they were having to think differently about what they believe and to consider Jesus and just who he was. We know God has been speaking to them all their lives, and it was exciting to get to be a part of helping them hear that voice more and more as we were all together.

So the work after Spring Break has been wonderful as our students keep reaching out to them, and as we keep praying for them, and we keep the conversations going. And as we keep hoping that they will keep hearing his voice and seeing him through others and as we keep trying to get the scriptures in front of them and praying they will come into a life-changing relationship in Jesus.

Thank you all so much again!! We cannot say enough thanks to everyone and for all you are doing to help us reach students from Nebraska to Nepal to Bangladesh to Vietnam to Green City. It's been so exciting and we know it only gets better — because we know God is real, and Jesus is alive and moving.

If you could pray for our students that they would always make sure they're hearing the gospel for their own hearts when they're sharing it with others. We want to always always make sure our students are working "from" his love not "for it" because we know they were always meant to live in that love all their lives once they hear it and know it and give their lives to Jesus.

Thank you all so much for everything and thank you God that you came for us all... and you know us completely!! Our lives in you could be so much better, but we're so grateful you love us and came so we could have forgiveness and hope and peace and life... from the inside out!
