BSU Update...Missionaries

"I am born again believer!" That was the response to our question (Are you interested in faith? Are you spiritual? Are you seeking maybe?) we asked an international student who had come by our free Bible and book table in the Student Union Building. It was so exciting to hear her story of almost becoming Muslim, before others in the Philippines helped her connect to the message of Jesus. So many from her country are not followers of Jesus historically. Now we are getting to help her connect to church here.

It was just another gentle reminder, of how we do not know what is going on in the background, and how much God is doing to pursue people. It is amazing that we get to be a part of His mission to bring life to others when we are a mess and so in need of His grace and mercy.

Over half the students who are stopping at our table are not believers. It is so exciting to see our students pushing past their fear to talk and engage with others who do not love Jesus or trust his word or want to go to church.

We are so thankful to you for loving and supporting us so that it allows us to be here. To go even when we don't know all the answers and will not be sure how to answer everything asked.

It has been so exciting in the little over one week that we have been back to have students sharing things like - "Hey I want to convert to Baptist from what I was before..." We are having conversations to help them know Jesus and the Scriptures and have a personal relationship with Him. Students are saying "I want to serve more; I really loved doing this more than I thought I would." Some want to talk about being a staff person after they graduate. God is doing so much and is being so kind to allow us to be a part of such huge decisions they are making right now in their lives.

The impact is more than we know right now. One girl stopped by and shared she was part of a sorority that we reach out to. She shared that she is now engaging in a small group for women and beginning to re-think her involvement in her faith personally. She had not been attending church since she started college. She is now a junior, and is beginning to re-engage and re-discover her faith - wow God! And we may have had no impact on that - but it is exciting to think that we have been serving her sorority and hope it leads to more for God.

One of our students shared how much he is growing and wanting to follow God in a real personal relationship, not religion. He is now sharing lists of verses with his dad who does not normally read the Bible. His dad is really reading and liking the verses his son is giving him.

Missions Committee Update

The Missions Committee was able to help foster families of Adair County around Christmas time. The little money these families receive doesn't go far when they are providing food, clothing, and diapers for these kids. There are times when the child shows up with only the clothes on their backs. In emergency situations, the host family may not even have a toddler bed for the child. So, our Missions Committee bought a toddler bed with mattress, a bed that would grow from crib to toddler with mattress, 4 sets of crib sheets, several boxes of diapers and pull ups, several smaller bags of diapers, and several boxes of wipes. The social workers we gave these to almost cried, they were so grateful. They said this would help so many families that were struggling as they were sharing their home and their love. We also donated nine \$10 gift certificates for them to give to the families as a small thank you. It took five Wal-Mart carts to carry everything. Here are some pictures of the supplies.


