Have you heard of **Roman Emperor Marcus Aurelius**? Legend has it that **Emperor Aurelius** had a servant who would follow him around and tell him, "*Look behind you! Remember you are only a man*."

It was his way of reminding himself of the brevity of life and to stay focused. Thankfully, we don't need someone to follow us around and remind us of that, but we do need help staying on mission.

Just before His return, Jesus met with his followers in Acts. Luke explains that (Acts 1:3)<sup>3</sup> He presented himself alive to them after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the <u>kingdom of God</u>.

Think of what it must have been like to hear the risen Jesus teach on such things. Just before he leaves, naturally the disciples want to know more about what's next. Instead of covering the end times, Jesus turns their attention to the mission.

Jesus explains (Acts 1:7-8) "...It is not for you to know <u>times</u> or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. <sup>8</sup> But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Jesus gives them their mission. They go and live for His kingdom. How did that go? They turn the world upside down. As we start this new year, may that be our desire too. Let us live for His Kingdom as His witnesses for His mission.

This is something we know is true because God is alive and well and moving in so many places! It is exciting to realize when you step into a relationship with Jesus that he constantly wants us to live out of that love that he has for us every day as we try to follow him and help our campus we love hear about the message of Jesus. God is not in love with the universe...He is in love with you... and with the people around us.

We wanted to say how incredibly grateful we are that there are so many praying for us and that number is growing more and more! Those prayers are being heard and it is making such a difference in the opportunities God is allowing us to be a part of in this generation today and that will impact the next generation, and the next and so many more.

Our students have been investing in their friends and new acquaintances and the conversations have been happening all over the place. For example one of our girls getting to be with a girl from Sri Lanka, who she met at the new international student meal we do every semester. She got to hang out with this girl one day shopping and talking. It is hard to count how much that is continuing to impact this girl who is interested in Jesus and wanting to understand more about him.

So many of our students have been mentoring with their younger peers and it's just exciting to see how that draws students closer to Jesus and how much they are taking on new things.

We were able to have a hay ride in the beautiful countryside of Unionville with Kevin Collins and Omaha Baptist Church. It was really meaningful for everyone and especially for the International students, who had never experienced such a thing. But even more who got to see an actual barn and hear about Jesus being born in a barn. Since then we get to keep counting the conversations about Jesus and Christmas.

We were able to travel to two of our local churches to help bring worship on Sunday mornings and that was so meaningful to be together and see so many who are faithfully loving and praying for them all through the year.

One of our girls from Nigeria was baptized. That came about because we've had several baptized this semester. On the way home from church after one of those baptisms, she asked us in the car if that's something she could do that she didn't get a chance to do at home. Of course we were thrilled, and we got to meet with Curtis at Rehoboth Baptist Church and were able to celebrate together with the church and with her friends.

We hosted a Thanksgiving meal as an opportunity to keep creating moments to invite friends who might be interested in Jesus or who may not be interested at all. We saw this meal grow from 50 students last year, to this year 97 students representing over 14 countries with so many of them who do not have a personal relationship with Jesus...not yet.

This December we got to share with three Chinese students about Jesus in the Christmas story. I had the wonderful privilege from seeing our students loving and investing in them all semester long with many conversations, to have the opportunity to share with them why Jesus came and why God loves and wants us all to have a relationship with Him thru Jesus and how Christmas connects to Jesus and the shepherds and the Magi. And all of this they had never heard in their life and then, that evening I got to share with three Nepal guys about Jesus and the nativity and the story that they also had never heard as we hosted a group picture. So we got to have these guys come and be a part of the picture outside by the huge Christmas tree. So after the picture we were walking back and for the first time in their lives they were able to hear about how God came for us all when no one else is coming for us...and Jesus is his name. We were getting to share the scriptures and the stories of Jesus because we get the chance to be there because of people like you who faithfully are praying and giving and supporting us to help us have conversations.

Is there a distance that's too far for God? No... From students from Green City to a girl who works at Aldi, to guys from China and Nepal. It's incredible that the only distance that matters is the distance in your heart. Merry Christmas and Happy New year everyone! The future is full of hope because God does not want to leave anyone behind, but to help everyone find forgiveness and love and hope and meaning today that goes on through forever. Who are we not willing to leave behind?

#### Small Group Update

I think a new year is motivational because it marks an end and beginning. It's an invitation to look at what has passed in the last 365 days, both the good and the not-so-good, and evaluate how your life and personality changed from those blessings and adversities. A year's worth of living will change most of us, hopefully for the better.

#### Lottie Moon Christmas Offering

Lottie Moon was sent as a Southern Baptist missionary to China from 1873 to 1912. She saw firsthand the world's greatest problem — LOSTNESS. Meeting so many people who had never heard the gospel compelled her to write letters to American churches describing the need for a greater missionary presence. She pleaded for increased prayer and financial support to send and sustain more missionaries. This challenge became known as the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering<sup>®</sup>.

Since 1888, the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering<sup>®</sup> for international missions has supported Southern Baptist missionaries as they share the gospel around the world. The offering represents 59 percent of IMB total annual support. Every penny you give to the offering goes directly to support missionaries, including salaries, medical care, housing, transportation, and children's education.


