Godly Success

The graduating class of '53 (Yale University) was surveyed twenty years after graduating. It was revealed that 3% of the class had accumulated greater wealth than the other 97% combined. The 3% all had one thing in common. What was it that the 3% had done? They had written out their goals for their life in '53. In other words, they had a clear vision for their life.

Now, this is not a plea for you to find a vision so you can amass great wealth. Instead, this is a plea to seek a greater treasure – godly success.

After the death of Moses, God speaks to Joshua. With the loss of Moses and now the burden of leadership, Joshua had a lot on his plate. Undoubtedly, he had many questions.

God calms Joshua's fears and gives guidance on how Joshua can be successful in this new role. God says in **Joshua 1:6-7** *Be strong and courageous, for you shall cause this people to inherit the land that I swore to their fathers to give them.* ⁷ *Only be strong and very courageous, being careful to do according to all the law that Moses my servant commanded you. Do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, that you may have good success wherever you go.*

God gives a simple message to the leadership and the rest of God's people here. Godly Success starts with listening to God's word and living out God's commands. Though he encounters many challenges, God proves himself faithful to Joshua and His people repeatedly. The same is true for all those who follow God now.

The next couple verses are more of the same. **Joshua 1:8-9** ⁸ *This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.*

⁹ *Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."*

God gives a clear message with a clear vision. When you listen to God's word and obey it then you will live biblically. There's no greater success than living for His glory and His name.

BSU update... For the whoever's

Happy winter everyone! Hope you're staying warm! We are so grateful for you and so many others who pray for us and move with action in so many ways to support the BSU as missionaries to our campus we love.

You should know we are having so many conversations and interactions with people who have no Jesus. And it's happening because of the prayers and just how kind God is to let us be a part of what he's doing.

We're so excited because we're seeing more of our students praying and acting and serving students who are not a part of a church or not a part of the Christian faith. I'm getting pictures left and right of our students and in the pictures are them and two or three others or even more who have no faith in Jesus, and our students are taking them places and having conversations and they're just serving them and being voices of hope at the same time.

If there was a quick rundown or summary, it would be that we are serving...and having conversations that are at least 1 hour and 45 minutes long at the shortest and then are stretching to about three hours long, about life and faith. And our community is getting to have them with students from all over the world, including here from America. From the Nepalese students to Bangladesh to China to Nigeria to Vietnam to Kansas City, the conversations are happening and they're happening again and again. And we love that because they're just getting to hear about Jesus more and more and more. God is doing so much with the mess that we are and we love that they are not running from us...but to us with needs and questions and real vulnerability as they share.

Something I personally love is that our students are working from his love not for it. They're hearing how much God loves them as we mentor and serve our fellow followers of Jesus, so that they are operating out of a healthy place. That's been encouraging itself because we've got to also see students who know Jesus, become healthier. For example, one guy started coming over because he really wanted to change his behaviors and habits that are not as healthy and keep him broken. I love that they're being motivated by his love because they're hearing the gospel for their own hearts when they're trying to share the gospel with others.

And that's just within the past couple weeks. So we have so much to be grateful for and so much that we are hopeful for as we keep trying to go and bring the message of Jesus to every corner of our campus.

Our Primary will always be the outsider...the person with no Jesus because we actually care about them and we know if the mission is first, the beautiful thing is that community becomes such a deeper more beautiful meaningful byproduct and I love how God does that!

From conversations, to watching us share a book like *The Case for Christ* with one guy who has read the entire book in a couple weeks, even with classes, and is now sharing it with one of his fraternity brothers. To moments like one of our guys having a conversation with his atheist friend for three hours until 4 AM. The college world they live in is really its own crazy world and I'm so thankful that we get the opportunity to be the missionaries here who make disciples who make disciples...in this wilderness called college.

For the ones who may not know or maybe do not trust or maybe never really heard or truly experienced a real forgiveness and the real love of God thru His son Jesus and the Holy Spirit.

For the whoever's...For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. The scripture's in the book of John in chapter 3, verse 16.

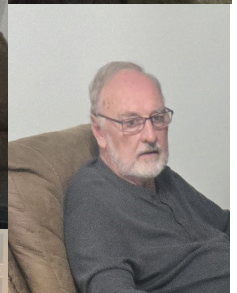

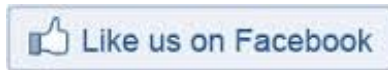
