Pastor Tim Ingle Living the Blessed Life

If you ask five different people what it means to live a blessed life you will likely get five different answers. How would you answer that question, how do you live a blessed life?

The answers may include fewer problems, better health, or less stress. Yet you know that having all those things are not guarantees of a blessed life.

Instead, Psalm 1 shows that the blessed life is developed through what you give yourself to. Psalm 1:1 says, "Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;"

The warning is clear. Be careful of the voices you listen to, the company you keep, and the thoughts you entertain. They all shape you. Know that daily you make choices, and those choices end up making you. Be careful with what and who you let into your life.

How else do you live a life that God blesses? Psalm 1:2-3 says, "² but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night. ³ He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers."

The person who loves God will both think and act on God's word. Consider how you can let God's truth guide your decisions. Ask for His help in letting all that He's given you whether it's His word, His Son, His Spirit, or His church to help you live the kind of life that He blesses.

BSU update...the frontliners...

There are so many moments we are getting to have and so many relationships we are getting to build with students who have no Jesus. Thank you all so much for helping us to be on the front lines with so many amazing people who are dead and lost without Jesus.

Presence is the most powerful part of serving. So there is God coming himself as Jesus...

And here we go... trying to run in the mess that we are, but with Jesus as our Lord - to where the darkness is - not from it. Running to where the people are at in the fog, and in the dark corners of their lives on this campus.

A few moments we wanted to share that God is allowing us to be a part of. Thank you all so much for praying for us! It matters so much! He is so good.

Last Sunday, we visited a church. A girl had the opportunity to sing with us who had walked away from her faith. She is starting to become interested again, but it would mean a total life transformation for her and those in her life (mainly her boyfriend). She has found that the BSU is very friendly and loving, and she is starting to invite her boyfriend too. They are having some hard times right now, so we will definitely make an effort to talk to and encourage them.

We have had a girl in the BSU take a special interest in international students. She and another have been providing them with laundry help, rides to the store, company, and assistance with other life needs. They are showing love to them that I know is appreciated.

Also, we have noticed that people around the BSU have been mixing up social groups after the Thursday night service is over. It got kinda late last week and some people had to leave immediately, but a lot of conversations with people who aren't already familiar with each other have been happening.

One of the things staff was excited about implementing this semester was more of a Bible study feel to our Thursday worship nights. We started calling them "weekly gatherings" and set out tea and hot chocolate at the beginning of the evening and started a few minutes after 7 PM so that people could visit and not feel rushed to just sit down and listen. At some point in the evening, there is a time for groups to discuss the topic being presented. The mini-series for this semester is accounts from the Gospels, Jesus' parables and things He did. The focus, of course, being Jesus and how He changes lives. We still sing worship songs and pray but students now are hearing from each other about living as a Christian and discussing real examples from their own lives.

Two of our freshmen girls have been involved and reaching out to nonbelievers. A couple weeks ago, one of our staff had asked two international students if they needed a ride to Walmart. When they told her that they were available, she couldn't take them. She felt horrible about offering and then not being able to follow through! But she found out later that one of the freshmen girls had taken them for groceries and also had taken them to eat at a local pizza place. We were so grateful that God had provided the international students with help and that He placed one of our girls in their path and she had listened to His call to help.

We are here to serve. We choose to be present. We are missionaries from our churches.

We are the frontliners. We made that decision a long time ago when we gave our lives to Jesus...to be on the front lines so we would leave no one behind, but that we could bring the message of Jesus to every corner of our campus.


Youth Events

Women's Ministry


