Initially, the fisherman thought the young man was throwing rocks or shells. As he got closer, he realized the young man was throwing starfish back into the sea. The shore was littered with them.

"What are you doing?" the fisherman asked.

"I'm saving starfish," the young man replied. "If they don't make it back to the water, they will suffer under the hot sun and die."

The fisherman looked up and down the shore, seeing the size of the task. "You can't possibly save all these starfish. There are just way too many for you to rescue them all."


Did you know we pass on old materials to be used again? If you have any old Bibles, Sunday School books, study materials, or even music you would like to donate, bring them to the office.

Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions

The North American Mission Board provides services for missionaries in the United States, Canada, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Guam, and American Samoa. To date over \$2 billion has been donated. 11,000 churches have been planted since 2010 in North America. The national goal this year is \$78 million while our goal here at HSBC is \$2650. What will your part be?


