Pastor Tim Ingle A Faithful Servant

In 1 Samuel, we meet Hannah. She has her share of burdens. Hannah carries the pain of childlessness. She's mocked by a cruel rival. Her husband is well-meaning but can't seem to say the right thing to comfort her.

The Bible conveys to us real people like us. They have their flaws and deal with difficulties like the rest of us. What does Hannah do with these burdens that she carries?

Hannah turns to God and prays. What stands out in her prayer in **1 Samuel 1:10-11** is her use of the word "servant". She refers to herself in this way three times. This perception helps her weather this storm and God later blesses her with children.

Like Hannah, God hears our prayers. He's present even when it seems like He's nowhere to be found. Though God does not always answer our prayers how we want, He remains faithful. He serves us daily by meeting our needs.

What helps Hannah is her mindset of a servant. How helpful do you suppose it would be for us to take on this same mindset? Did you know that Jesus took on the mindset of a servant, too. His life was not easy. Jesus weathers the storm of God's wrath. Jesus gives His life to serve God's greater purposes. Jesus defeats our cruel rival.

Jesus says of himself in **Mark 10:45** (ESV), "For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Jesus gave His life to be a faithful servant. We are called to serve, too. Jesus reveals in **John 12:26** (ESV), *"If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him."*

Jesus faithfully served. How will you follow in His steps and serve today?

It's been a wonderful season. Easter has been one of the best gateways into conversations with so many who don't believe. We've gotten to share about Jesus and the Easter story with several students from several countries. When talking to them and asking them what do they know about Easter or how does Jesus fit into Easter their responses across the board have been that they know about "...Easter eggs... And that's about it". So it's been humbling and amazing getting to plant seeds and be light in such lives where the message of Jesus is so unknown and unheard of and unthought of to them.

It's been exciting seeing our students continue to build relationships with others, and watching them encourage and bring others into being a part of the mission of Jesus in small ways and big ways...and everything is big when it comes to just trying to plant a seed and create space for God to move and work in so many lives.

We held a sunrise service on Friday before students left for Easter break. It was really fun being out there on the top of the hill by Barnett Hall, which we all dread walking to when we have classes there ha ha. But this was different this morning because we were celebrating together, Jesus, and everything he did for us all on that Good Friday. And we are so thankful for all of you guys who pray for us and support us and help us keep trying to know his love in a changing relationship with Jesus, and bring his love to so many others.
