Bringing People Back to God Part 1

What happens when a man of great power uses his power selfishly? History gives plenty of examples. One such man was Caligula. Though a man of power and great potential – he served himself and hurt many others due to his short-sightedness.

One source revealed that Emperor Caligula would write out his decrees in very small letters and post them so high that no one could read them. Still, he enjoyed punishing offenders for breaking those laws.

While Caligula expected glory and punished others with cruel intent, Jesus walked a different path. Jesus chose to welcome sinners so that he could heal, serve, and save. He possessed great power and showed great mercy.

In Luke 19, Jesus welcomes Zacchaeus. The Lord shows himself to be a friend of sinners who worked to bring people back to God.



It has been a huge blessing and so encouraging having you praying for us as we try to help our students who know Jesus to be healthy and have a genuine active love affair with God before they try to reach out to their friends and to our campus we love. Our semester ended with some wonderful moments and some new connections! Hearing our students share about what the BSU has meant to them and how they've grown closer to God and in trying to help people know Jesus has been so encouraging. Three new students signed up to be student leaders and it was exciting to hear how they were impacted by the amount of outreach that the BSU tries to do as a community to our campus. It's really encouraging that our heart of trying to reach the "outsiders" and the lost and trying to be a voice of hope to so many with "no Jesus "has been experienced by these students and how it has encouraged and brought these students in to the mission we have...to bring the message of Jesus to every corner of our campus we love.

It's been exciting getting to know the Truman Swim Team and the tennis team in new ways as we grow closer with the Truman Cheerleaders and several of the sororities and a fraternity that we are building relationships with! We're connecting with believers in those groups for the first time and getting to love and serve many in these groups who do not have a relationship with Jesus...not yet.

It's been a great ending to the semester and a wonderful beginning to the summer to continue connecting and having conversations about spirituality and Jesus with so many international students. This past week we had several hours of conversations with students from Hinduism to Buddhism. In the background, as one of our international students, a new believer in Jesus shared, is "radical love". It's pretty humbling to hear him share what an impact he sees among his fellow international students as he tries to be a light among his friends.


Here is a little glimpse into how we get the chance to "honorably disrupt" the lives and thoughts of those who are living disconnected from God's deep love. We showed up last Monday to give rides to six international students to the airport. There was an older man there with what appeared to be his younger daughter. We started helping the students load their luggage and saying goodbyes as they leave for summer and we started to talk to the dad who is from India visiting his son at Truman. We asked the dad and daughter questions about their lives. This led to us offering rides to Walmart while they are here for the week. Soon we are talking about faith and religion and he's sharing what he believes and we then share a little about Jesus and Christianity. We give the students their ride to the airport and come back to give this family a ride to Walmart.

A few days later we were able to have them over to our home. This was their first time being in an American home. They again shared about what they believe and we actually got to have some meaningful conversations about how Jesus is different than every religion and definitely a huge conversation around why everything is not the same and why 'that thought' really does not make sense in any part of life, especially in faith. The next day we were able to take them to church with us. They were able to meet and visit with the pastor and that was the first time being in a Protestant church. You just never know when you might get to be a voice of hope. The wife/mom shared after the church service that what she heard was basically the same thing she would hear back home in that you need to trust and believe and be faithful to your god. She heard things that were similar but also would not say that she sees how Jesus is so different...not yet. This is why we are here as missionaries at the BSU - to keep counting the conversations that could lead them to Jesus! The dad is now connected to us on Facebook! We've made a friend and are looking forward to visiting when the dad comes back next year. We will just keep messaging them and praying for them.

We had so much wonderful support from our local churches: Fellowship, Hamilton Street, La Plata, Yellow Creek, and Rehoboth for food for finals for students! We served around 120 people on Monday and Tuesday and on Wednesday we served well over 200 students. A girl said she doesn't come to anything else at the BSU, but she would not make it through finals if we did not do this. She expressed how grateful she was that though she may not believe what we believe she feels so welcomed and loved and was so thankful we were here. To be the place where students - even a family from India-want to come to... not run from, our hope is Jesus - He is who we will always talk about! Maybe this could lead this girl and others closer to God while they're here as students! It's not all the same...Jesus is like none other - and we love getting to always talk about HIM!
