The Joy of Being Found

Bringing People back to God - Part 3 Luke 15:5-6 (ESV)

Several years ago, we took our oldest granddaughter to the St. Louis Children's Museum. If you've ever been there, you know it's massive. One of the highlights is a slide that stretches six stories high. We got in line and once it was time, we raced each other to the bottom. It was a blast.

However, the slides exit in separate areas, and it was dimly lit. I looked around and I couldn't see her anywhere.

Tightness gripped my chest. I tried to stay calm, scanning the crowd walking quickly, calling her name. Seconds felt like minutes. Finally, I saw her. Safe and smiling and I've never felt such relief and joy.

That moment reminds me of Jesus's stories on the lost being found. The difference is, God never loses track of us. He always knows where we are. But when we turn back to him, he doesn't respond with frustration or scolding. He, and the rest of heaven, celebrates.

In Luke 15, Jesus tells a story about a shepherd who searches for a lost sheep. Jesus explains what happens when the lost is found:

Luke 15:5-6

And when he has found it, he will joyfully carry it home on his shoulders. When he arrives, he will call together his friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.'

I love that. There's no "where have you been" or "do you know what you have put me through?" It's joy and celebration. That is the heart of God. When the lost are found, heaven rejoices. May that be our hearts too, that we seek the lost and celebrate when they are found.

BSU update...only the 2nd one...

In the middle of summer...a few exciting things

For the last month and more across Truman State University, whenever staff open their computers to log onto their internal computer system the

picture that comes up is of the announcement to help with new freshman move-in.

Now that is pretty cool to see them inviting everyone to be a part of that really special and unique time in a family's life. But what's even cooler is that the picture is of our three students during freshmen move-in helping roll a cart down the hallway for a freshman. They're wearing their BSU t-shirts that say "With you" and one of them is wearing our BSU sweatshirt that says "I am my brother's keeper " with Genesis 4:9 on it.

We absolutely are so grateful in just how much God is allowing us to be used to help our whole campus maybe see Jesus and be more open to Him! How else does that happen except for God being so kind in spite of the mess we are—but just trying to become less of a mess in HIM. We are so grateful for the opportunities He is providing for us to be a voice of hope in the wilderness here - of so many new thoughts and ideas and beliefs. A couple other wonderful things have been in the conversations we are still getting to have over summer with students who do not believe.

The conversations have been very intentional around the thoughts of - "What are the questions we have in life" and even asking "What are the questions, that if we could answer them well, would help move you closer to actually trusting that Jesus is more than they thought." And the conversations are continuing, so we just keep counting the conversations as we pray for them to realize and come to their senses and see Jesus and give their lives to Him.

The responses have been so genuine and heartfelt. One of the guys we talk to is Buddhist but he really is interested in Jesus. In one of our conversations as we walked around campus he asked, "How do you pray? What does prayer mean to you? How does prayer work?" Then he had questions about, "What about the Pope?" It was humbling to get to hear more about Jesus and the scriptures with him.

Another student would share that "the BSU is his happy place!" That "he really loves to come here because he feels so loved here." He is Hindu, but still engages in conversations as we share how Jesus is the only way and truth and life.

Then another student who we have been having conversations with about leadership. We share how Jesus changes everything and how leadership is so different when you see how Jesus saw leadership (a lot of our talks are about leadership principles as he looks to be leading in a student group and looks to become president of that group next year). He comes from an eastern country but doesn't really have a faith or belief in anything - he would share that it's not been important to him.

In one of our conversations I asked him what he likes about "leading or being a leader; what draws him to this?" He shared the ability to have the power to move others to create something that is good for others. So I shared that yeah, that's really exciting that you see creating as such a big thing. And shared that we believe we were created with intention; we are here on purpose and that we were made by someone with a heart and a passion for us...God! And then shared that we were made on purpose - that we are works of art...and we were created - to create. All of this and more in this conversation because he asked "You are a minister, religious person right?" And as we walked and talked and then were sitting in the BSU talking he shared that he and his family had talked to a taxi driver back in his country who was a Christian and from that country, and now to me, and that I was only the 2nd person he has ever talked to about Jesus. Wow! God you are sending them here right now - into our own backyards so we can help them find life in Jesus!

And there are more conversations we are having with others right now over summer and getting to share about Jesus and why He came - it is just so amazing what God is allowing us to be a part of in this moment and place... in the wilderness!

We are so grateful for all of you who are supporting the BSU as your missionaries "in your own backyard" to so many - so close to home...and from lands so far away.

We need people to mingle among the visitors and make them feel welcome. Be praying for the event and what part you should play in it. There is definitely a place for everyone.


Children's Camp

MMO—Rheubin L. South Missouri Missions Offering


During the month of September we will be taking up the Missouri Missions Offering. These gifts support prayer and evangelism, church planting and renewal, missions mobilization, collegiate ministries, disaster relief, and ministries at six affiliated entities.

Last year Missouri's goal was \$760,000 and receipts totaled \$1,072,207. HSBC was one of 672 churches that contributed to the total by giving \$2,468. This year the statewide goal is \$800,000 and the Missions Committee will be setting our individual goal soon. The week of prayer for MMO will be September 7—14. You will receive prayer guides to help you pray for specific areas that MMO supports.
