#### The Joy of Being Found

Luke 15:7

Someone once said that there are at least two things that we will never do in heaven. One thing that we won't do in heaven is sin. And second, we won't evangelize in heaven. Everyone there will already know Him.

But here and now, we have this great privilege of sharing the good news and seeing people come to know Christ. After all, Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. In Luke 15, Jesus tells three stories about lost things being found. He gives us a glimpse into heaven's reaction to lost people turning to God.

Jesus says in Luke 15:7, In the same way, there is more joy in heaven over one lost sinner who repents and returns to God than over ninety-nine others who are righteous and haven't strayed away!

Until Jesus returns, we get to be part of that joy. We get to help people turn from sin and turn to Him and trust in Him.

God works through His people to reach those who don't know him.

Let's be a people who bring joy to heaven one life at a time.

... Exactly where we want to be

The summer has been really exciting with the opportunities God has been bringing for us to serve students here and to try and be a voice of hope to them. We got to help a Nepal student move into his apartment on campus. During the move, we had some good conversations

with him and other students from Nepal and Japan. None of them have a faith in Jesus and do not know very much about Him. I asked them if they believe in good and evil - is there evil in a sense that it is alive. After moving, the student shared that he had been thinking the whole time in Wal-Mart about that question about good and evil.

It's really exciting that by serving we're beginning conversations to help share Jesus and how much God is a vital part of life here today. We're really looking forward to the chance to have more conversations as we love him and his friends and be a voice of hope and help him connect to Jesus.

On another weekend, a church hosted a meal to have our students over to try and love them and be a light to them. We had several students come who had no personal relationship with Jesus.

One student who struggles with groups and emotions ended up sitting in a stairwell by himself and it was beautiful to see some of our students go sit with him and to see the church really care for him with love and patience. By the end of the night, he was interacting with several different church folks and then had a wonderful conversation with the pastor about life's struggles.

As we were ending the night, we saw a student standing outside by his girlfriend's car, but she was inside the car. I asked him if he needed anything and kind of joked with him like "Oh no did she kick you out of the car?" He said "No, she just doesn't let me smoke in the car." He actually came to several of our worship nights last semester. This is exactly where we want to be... among the ones who don't have a relationship in Jesus, but who are searching and wanting to feel alive and to have meaning in their lives...and are trying to find a place to be accepted and loved. This is exactly the people we are trying to reach with the message of Jesus! This is why we're here...we are for them, for you...for the whoever's... "For God so loved the world that whoever... - John 3:16

This is why we share with students as we serve and engage with them and feed them and love them. We know if you're here you'll experience something that you don't even know how to describe and why they want to come and be around the BSU. We know it's Jesus and we know He's speaking to them and moving through all creation and through His word, and through others as we try to share with them.

It is humbling to be a community of missionaries who are trying to help more people actually know who Jesus is and why he came for them and help them connect to HIM and to his family - the church! It is just so good getting to share about Jesus to students who are like new fields that no one has planted on, but God has been drawing to Himself and speaking to them all their lives! This is exactly where we should be...in the wilderness here at Truman...living by faith and being a voice of hope so one more can find forgiveness and life in the One who came for us before we believed in him...while we were still sinners...who has always been for us...for you! #### VBS Report 2025




Thank you to everyone for all the help! We had 63 kids who attended at least one night of VBS. We saw many children who


### Small Group Promotion


Return Service Requested
