Hate takes distance Love takes proximity

The Fall semester has had so much good in it and at the same time so much bad with what we see in the world. The killing of Charlie Kirk touches a lot of people, especially the college students that were

around. And it's no coincidence that the last few weeks we've been getting to engage in conversations about the idea of good and evil with students who do not believe in Jesus. So we know God is doing so much and we're so grateful we get to try and be faithful and help others know the message of Jesus and trust his love more, or maybe for the first time, come to know and give their lives to Jesus. We really appreciate all the prayers as we help students keep being reminded of God's faithfulness and goodness. It has been such a really good semester with how many students and staff we're getting to know and serve and interact with here on campus.

A few of the wonderful opportunities and openings we have been getting to have would include hosting a meal for the entire athletics department, which saw around 40 coaches and staff here in the building at the BSU hearing our heart for Jesus and our heart for our campus. This has led to some great beginnings of relationships that have allowed new spaces for us to serve and interact with students. Some of these include the swim team, men's soccer team, women's soccer team, women's basketball team, men's basketball team, girls tennis team and soon the football team.

Serving has really helped us open up some great conversations with students and we're so excited to keep counting the conversations as we try to help them take one step closer to Jesus.

We've had a lot of interactions and conversations about faith with international students from Nepal to Sri Lanka to Vietnam to China to Spain. Our students have been engaging so much through the oncampus tabling we do, through giving rides and through showing up at events like an interfaith trivia game night hosted by Truman. To also being present when the Nepal students put together a vigil for all the protest and killings that have happened back in their country. There we were with several of our students to keep being a voice of hope in the darkness for Jesus to so many in this community of Nepal students.

To end with would be the beautiful moment that was this past week when, after meeting a girl from Sri Lanka last year in the Fall through our international student meal that we host every semester, we got to watch this young woman give her life to Jesus with us in the prayer room at the BSU this last Sunday afternoon!! All glory to God!! It was an incredible moment as you got to see how God used so many of our students and so many others as they just made themselves available to serve and love and have conversations and to watch this girl become more and more drawn to Jesus through the year. We can't wait to celebrate her baptism together with everyone and with Pastor Tim at Hamilton Street Baptist Church in a few weeks!

And an exciting thing is the conversations are still continuing with others!! And something that's really been exciting for us is that we re-launched our Sunday night meals that we have been doing in our houses and now are doing at the BSU. It was a new step for us but it has been so amazing! We're seeing so many churches coming alongside and serving the meals each week and we've gone from a little over 60 people to now over 80 people in the first three times. So it's exciting that they're in the building and students from all over the world and all over in terms of faith - are interacting with them as these amazing loving church folks come each week serving the meal and getting to love them and talk to them. And these meals are becoming a good place for some long spiritual conversations we are getting to have with others who do not believe in Jesus. The students come for the food but now are hanging out and they're talking even more and just becoming more open because of the love I think they're experiencing through God through so many of the church folks and our students letting themselves be used by Him here. We are so so grateful to all the churches who are taking on so much to help us feed and reach so many...every week...with love and truth together!

So on behalf of all our student leaders and our staff thank you so much to everyone who's just been allowing God to use you here at the BSU through praying, serving, giving and showing up - to help us help so many, like this girl from Sri Lanka, to come to know the one who came for them to save them and to give them life and forgiveness through only one way...Jesus! And that is only possible because God came himself for us all.

Love takes proximity... and there is Jesus coming for us so we could all know how much we are worth! For you—BSU


#### Family Fun Day


