An Invitation and a Rescue Mission

Imagine standing on a riverbank during the spring thaw. The water is a churning, icy mess. Suddenly, a child falls in. The current is too fast, and it looks hopeless. But then, an uncle who's close by, jumps in. He braves the freezing water, grabs her, and pulls her to safety. If he hadn't jumped, she would have been lost.

This is more than a dramatic story; it's a spiritual reality. The Bible tells us that we are all caught in the currents and pressures of the world. We have struggles from within that carry us away from God. We don't need a self-help manual. We need a Rescuer.

In Luke 5, we see exactly how Jesus carries out this mission and how He invites us to join Him.

God Seeks the Unsavable.

Jesus didn't wait for people to clean themselves up before approaching them. He went directly to Levi, a tax collector. In the first century, tax collectors were viewed as scum and traitors of their own people. They were banned from worship and legal courts.

Yet, Jesus looked at Levi and said, "Follow me." No matter how far you feel from God, you are never beyond His reach. Jesus says in Luke 19:10, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

The Levi Strategy

After meeting Jesus, Levi didn't go into hiding. He threw a massive banquet. He invited all his "outcast" friends to his home so they could meet Jesus, too.

The religious elite complained, asking why Jesus would eat with such people. His response in Luke 5:31 is simple, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick." Jesus was looking for those who needed rescuing.

Being a disciple simply means being a follower who becomes like the Teacher. If Jesus is on a rescue mission, we should be too. That is why we are hosting a **Super Bowl get-together** right here at the church! Like Levi's banquet, this is a chance for us to open our doors, be generous, and provide a space where people can feel at home and watch the game together.

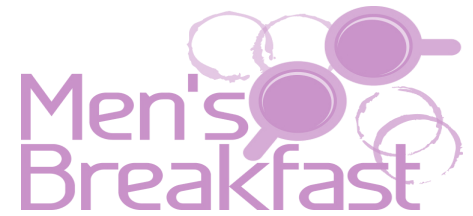

Happy New Year everyone!!

We are so hopeful and grateful for the opportunities we pray God will allow us to be a part of in the new year ahead!

But to give a little recap of December would be to share a couple activities and two small moments in seeing students coming closer to Jesus.

It was a quick month with finals coming in the second week of December, but in that time we were able to interact with students and serve over 300 meals to students who came to the BSU in those two weeks. We also hosted a meal for the entire Truman athletic department to celebrate the successes among their students and teams and to get to share Jesus' heart for our campus.

Some moments: one was traveling together as a community on a night of 13° to experience a Christmas story. We journeyed to different locations in town to help bring out the scriptures in a beautiful way. Such as by going to a local hotel "Knights Inn" to talk about Mary and Joseph not finding any room for them and having to be in a stable where Jesus would be born, to going to the University Farm as we talked about the shepherds and angels and the star that guided the Magi.

Another moment was getting to hear one of our international students that we meet with weekly share how much he hopes one day he will be Christian like us as he keeps trying to listen with his mind and with his heart. He is listening and talking with us weekly and has heard the gospel. We are praying he will see his need for forgiveness thru Jesus and he will also see that it is giving up his life so Jesus can be his Lord and God would be his one and only God he would love and worship.

To visiting with another international student over Christmas break and sharing with him all the characters in the Christmas story at the nativity scene and talking about why Jesus came and sharing the gospel with him again. He has heard us share about the gospel with him directly before, but this was the first time he had heard about who all the people were in the nativity scene and how it connects to Jesus and to God's plan to save us from our sins.

It's so humbling to stand there and realize you're planting on "new ground" as we stood together in the BSU looking at a little nativity scene we got from a thrift store years ago. It's amazing to get to be missionaries here to so many from so far away; from "foreign lands", who are right here in our backyard.

One more moment: towards the end of semester right before finals, I was on campus walking with a fellow minister as we were sharing about ministry and family when all of a sudden an American college girl came running out from behind me. She ran past us on the sidewalk and then came and stopped in the path we were walking. She stood there smiling and then very enthusiastically shared that she grew up in an "...awful church and wanted to tell us that she was really thankful for what we were doing with the Sunday night meals." She shared she has been wanting to tell me how grateful she was for several weeks during the meals, but couldn't find the courage to come up and say something. So she said with some excitement and emotion: "I knew I needed to run up and tell you now. I wanted you to know how much the meals mean to her and to others and how thankful I am for what you guys are doing on Sunday nights with these!"

What we are doing together matters. God is using our "jars of clay" efforts in such amazing ways in people's lives. Oh how we do not deserve to be a part of what he is doing because we are such a mess and make so many mistakes and have so much sin in our lives; it is more than we, or I personally, could ever ask or imagine for...to get to actually be a part of His work in seeing others changing their minds about God and about what he loves, His church. We are so grateful!

Super Bowl Viewing

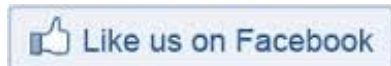

Giving Envelopes

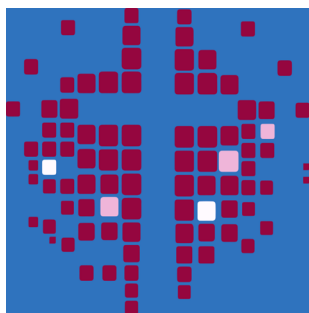
