WHY IS THIS MOBILE MARKET ENDING?

After significant consideration, The Food Bank will discontinue our Mobile at Hamilton Street Baptist Church after its last run in **April 2026**. Mobile Markets help share food at no cost with those who live in areas without brick-and-mortar pantries. With half a dozen partner agencies in Adair County, we are focusing our efforts on these existing resources.

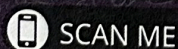
Brick-and-mortar resources includes Pantry for Adair County, which is open three days a week. In general, brick-and-mortar pantries will be able to provide you with more food resources per visit than a Mobile Market. Additionally, some may offer the added benefit of allowing you to choose the food you take home.

What information will pantries ask for?

In most cases, agencies may ask for general information - like your name and birth date, the names and birth dates of those in your household, your income and other demographic information to help us better tailor our programs in the future.

In general, brick-and-mortar pantries offer more food and higher nutrition than Mobile Markets. While the types of food depend on the agency, you will likely find both shelf-stable and fresh items like meat, dairy and produce.
