Imitating Jesus: Returning to His Way

Most churches today are busy. There is no shortage of activity. Yet beneath all this activity, an uncomfortable question seems to surface: are we making disciples who make disciple makers?

For many of us, discipleship is something that happens inside the building, during a class, or for a limited season. But when we look at Jesus, that is not His model. Jesus did not call people to programs or to buildings. Jesus called people to form and shape people. And those people went on to change the world. It's vital that we return to Jesus's original approach and imitate Him.

What Jesus Actually Did

What was clear from Jesus's approach was that He desired to share His life. He invited people into a relationship that reshaped how they lived, loved, and lead. From the very beginning, discipleship was personal, intentional, and relational.

Jesus modeled spiritual power, personal transformation, and invested in people. By studying the gospels, we could sum Jesus's mission with this phrase: to be with Jesus, to become like Jesus, for the sake of the world.

Discipleship for Now

In Jesus's day, discipleship meant total commitment. A disciple learned from the teacher and adopted their teacher's way of life. Jesus took that familiar model and transformed it. He called ordinary people. He emphasized service. Jesus formed followers of Himself. That's where many of us feel the tension today. It's the temptation to settle for gathering in crowds instead of walking closely with Him and with His people.

Five Marks of a Disciple Who Multiplies

Jesus's model still works and it still challenges us now. A disciple grows best in a loving **community**. A disciple hears and **obeys God's word**. A disciple learns **His way of ministry** by studying and practicing it. A disciple grows in **Christlike character**, shaped over time through spiritual disciplines. And finally, a disciple **reproduces** by helping others follow Jesus too.

His final command was clear: *Make disciples*.² Not programs. Not consumers. Disciples are people who follow Him, obey Him, and help others do the same. This series will explore what it looks like to imitate Jesus as the disciple maker, beginning with how people first encountered him and moving toward lives that remain deeply rooted in Him. The path is not complicated, but it is costly. Next month, we'll begin where Jesus often began, "Come and see."

BSU update - ...yes we love our sweets...but also...

What a wonderful, encouraging season it has been. Last week I received a message from a student that said, "Hey, Greg. How are you doing? Let me know if you have some time to walk around and talk!" So we got together and he started sharing some of the things that have been going on in his life and how he wants to know God, and wants to grow in Jesus. This guy is from an Asian country, and when we last spoke in a real conversation, he was definitely Muslim, and definitely was not interested or moved at all by the message of Jesus as we shared it with him. So, this conversation last week has been the beginning of several conversations, and we're trying to help him keep connecting to the church. But there's been such a total change from two years ago till now, and we would just ask for your prayers for him as he tries to understand who Jesus is.

I overheard one of my students sharing with another BSU student saying, "He's been coming because he really wants to try and become a good representative of Jesus." And we've shared the gospel with him, and he knows he is not a believer yet, but he would indicate that he is very close, and we just are praying that he will realize his need for forgiveness and how much God loves him thru Jesus and dying for his sins and take that step of faith. So, that has been amazing to see someone so seemingly far from God, and now we're getting the opportunity to be a part of His work. And it's beautiful watching our community be welcoming and accepting and loving. Some other exciting things have been getting to mentor another Asian student who gave his life to Jesus this semester, and meeting with him weekly. It's been so exciting watching him being excited about not just learning more about the Bible, but how good it is to try and help other people know Jesus. Last week, we were sitting and talking with another student, and he was sharing some thoughts about his life and what he desires, and it was just beautiful to watch him have an "a-ha" moment where as we shared that he cannot be spiritually healthy until he is spiritually alive. And then sharing about being "born again" and what that looks like and why we celebrate with birthday cake when someone gives their life to Jesus. And it was so funny because in that moment, he went: "Oh, I get it now! I've seen you guys when you've had birthday cakes for people. I thought it was just that you really liked sweets!" We do like sweets, but there's such a bigger meaning behind our birthday cakes at the BSU. It was so fun to help him connect the dots that the cake is really because someone is alive in Jesus and has been "born again". It was such a good reminder for our community to not just assume because they've been around a while, they've got it all figured out, and surely they've heard that because we've said it umpteen times.

This month we did a lot of outreach on campus. It was so encouraging seeing more of our students becoming more involved in outreach themselves. We had our seniors share moments about their time here at college and the BSU. One of the questions was something like, "What are your favorite memories?" or, "What did the BSU mean to you?" And what was beautiful was hearing them sharing, and all their big memories were practically all from things they were doing with the BSU where they were serving together. God always brings community as a beautiful side product! And that's always been our heart, that we would care so much about the outsiders and the lost, that our primary goal would always be the people with no Jesus. So what a beautiful large picture of seeing the things we're trying to do to keep the mission in front of ourselves and to see the benefit of people being "born again", and seeing how these students are getting so much more meaning from when they're trying to work from his love and be on a mission together here.

The last little side note was the BSU was recognized for the highly honored "Spirit of Truman Award" that the entire athletics department gives to one or two people/groups every year. This year, we were recognized along with a gentleman who runs the Pershing Arena building. So it was humbling to be a small student organization trying to reflect Jesus, who received such a notable award. We hosted a meal for the athletics department. During the meal, I was sitting with the head football coach, talking about culture and how much that matters in every arena of life. At one moment, he said, "Oh, I got to tell you. That verse you were having us say out loud this past Fall with the whole football team...(and then he was trying to remember it), "I am...I am... my brother's keeper". And I'm like, "Oh, yeah. 'I am my brother's keeper' from Genesis." And he goes, "Oh, yeah, that's it! Yeah, I was at a Big Ten school, I think in Oklahoma," he said, "And I was on there touring with my family, and we were going through the tour, and we came into the big athletics building." And he said, "When we walked in, the first thing you saw as you looked up was this huge sign across the whole front," and it said, "I am my brother's keeper." And he said, "I saw that, and I knew I had to tell you when I saw you again!"

That's just so cool to see how God opens doors to communicate more of the gospel to others. Thank you so much for all the prayers! He is hearing them. And the financial support that is growing...it is making a difference.

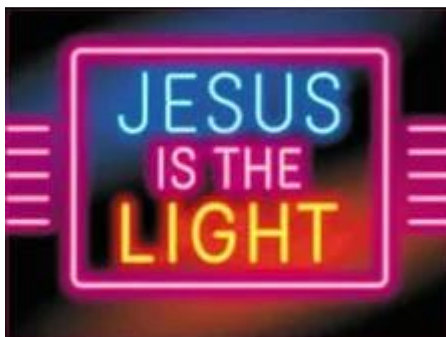

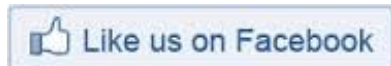

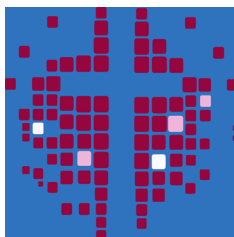
