Imitating Jesus and Making Disciple Makers—Part 2

When Jesus began His public ministry, He faced the greatest mission the world has ever known. It was a mission to rescue a people who often did not realize they needed to be rescued.

So, what drew people to Jesus? Hunger. People sensed they needed something and that Jesus was the one to help meet that need. In this series, we are walking step-by-step with those first disciples. What does it truly cost you to follow Jesus and how can we help others follow Him, too?

A Prelude to Commitment

John the Baptist's ministry was about preparation. His ministry helped people get ready to repent, recognize the Messiah, and respond when Jesus called.

Many ministries of preparation serve this purpose today. Small groups, VBS, fellowships and service teams all create places where relationships grow and spiritual hunger becomes visible. Wise disciple-makers learn to watch, listen, and patiently recognize when someone is ready for a deeper invitation.

An Invitation to Be With the Master

In **John 1:38** Jesus asks, "What are you seeking?" And they said to him, "Rabbi" (which means Teacher), "where are you staying?" Jesus asked the question to reveal their hearts. Before He invited them into mission, He invited them to examine their desire.

Jesus' answer was simple: "Come and you will see." He invited them to be with him and to watch him firsthand.

John 1:39 continues, "He said to them, 'Come and you will see.' So they came and saw where he was staying and they stayed with him that day, for it was about the tenth hour." Here Jesus makes the invitation clear.

For believers seeking to recruit and develop disciples, this is important: Ask the Holy Spirit for spiritual understanding. Get His help in viewing people as souls to be loved, served, and guided toward Jesus.

John 1:46 records Nathanael's skepticism, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" And what did Jesus say to this? He simply said, "Come and see."

Invited to Walk

Jesus meets people where they are. During the early months of His ministry, Jesus allowed people to watch and learn. He answered questions. He invited curiosity. He did not force commitment, even though He was the Savior. He started with the heart.

This week, consider one person you can invite to "come and see." It may be an invitation to coffee, a Bible study, a conversation after a worship service, or simply a chance to walk alongside you. Disciple-making often begins with a faithful presence. It consists of a patient invitation, and takes a heart ready to point others to Jesus.

BSU update...Moms and Jesus!

So, I just got done talking with one of the students. He is from a Buddhist background and today he was sharing with me how he was sharing stuff with his mom. His mom shared with him a story about her going to a church in her country and there was a story about Mary the mother of Jesus showing up at a well of water. At the time there was an illness going around, and Mary told the people to drink from this well and they would get better. People were getting healed after they drank from the well. So the mom shared with her son that she went there because she wanted him, who was inside her as a baby, to be able to be healthy and have a good life.

Now what's so good about this is not so much the story which was passed around among the people but that our student, the son, did not realize how much his mom knew about Christianity. The mom shared more and then shared in a list how Christians view things and how Buddhists view things and she was really accurate on the points she shared.

So it was a huge conversation for him hearing that there were things his mom knew about Christianity that we were talking about together here on the couches at the BSU and he never knew that his mom knew those things. And it was kind of funny cause then she would share some stuff and he said he would play along like it was all new to him, but that we've already been talking about stuff that she was sharing ha ha.

What we think is so amazing in what God is doing is that he is now wanting to ask his mom more about what she knows about Jesus and is gonna be talking to his mom more about the conversations we're having and asking more questions about what she knows about Jesus. AND...also why did she not tell him these things that she knew about Christianity.

It's so what only God can do!! The student then shared with me that he feels like he's the translator between me and his mom and he's relaying information!" It's so exciting that we're sharing and talking about the gospel with him and he now is excited about hearing what his mom knows and also talking about what he's hearing in our conversations with his mom. Wow God!!

Now this gets crazier because two weeks ago we met with a girl from Bangladesh. She comes from a Muslim world in Bangladesh, but she personally does not trust in Islam. So we've been having conversations and then two weeks ago, she shared how much her mom loves hearing about the things that her daughter is learning about Jesus.

She went on to say that she now shares what we talk about with her mom and that her mom is asking her questions and wants to hear more. While we were sitting down talking, she shared that "Hey guys right before I came over here my mom told me to listen and pay attention to them really well."

It is just amazing how God is using two students who are hearing about Jesus, but don't trust him yet, and God is using them as missionaries to their own families in the craziest way through the conversations we are having by sitting on couches in the BSU week after week after week.

It is all because of God and all He is doing to bless the things we try to do in spite of the mess we are. It is no small thing to have the opportunities we've been given because of God using and allowing so many churches and church folks and alumni and friends all over the BSU to support us with so much love and prayers and sacrificial giving financially. We are overwhelmed with the love that God is bringing through so many to make it possible again and again for us to actually do tangible things to create moments to lead to conversations that lead to more conversations and lead to sharing the gospel and that they're hearing about Jesus for the first time! And now their moms are hearing things about Jesus and who God is and how the Holy Spirit works and moves... for the first time!

Thank you all so much for allowing God to use you here among this generation of students from all over the world - to pray for our students as we try to share the gospel and as we get to create moments for God to breathe into...and for a building He is using to allow us to invite people to sit in, eat in, cry in, laugh in, share Jesus in, pray in, watch students over the years give their lives to Jesus in - from the kitchen, to the coffee bar, to the water fountain, to the prayer room, to sitting together in the big green chairs! And to keep getting to create more moments for people to hear things they've never heard before about God and his love, about Jesus and the cross, about heaven and hell and about the good news and life in Jesus. This gospel that we all believe in is strong enough for any culture, any time, any place, any circumstance, and anyone's backstory, because the gospel of Jesus is the good news! And the treasure... is Jesus! It's always been about intimacy, and relationship. Because God has always wanted us to live... Alive in his forgiveness and in his love... alive in Jesus.

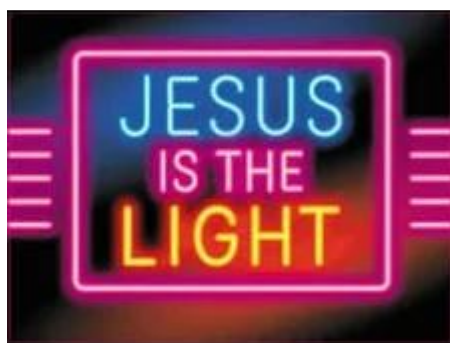
Church Picnic

Please let Becky know if you would be willing to help out at Family Night. We can't wait to see what God will do through this special week!

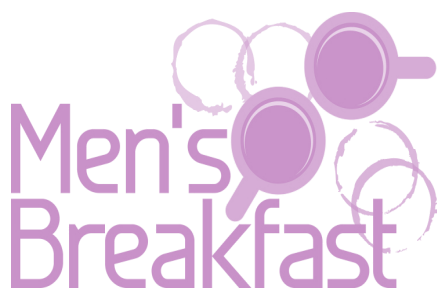

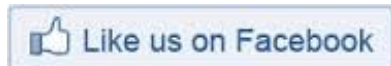

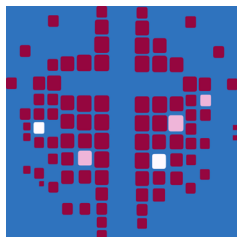
